The Road Committee has scheduled some significant road work for November and the winter. These efforts should greatly reduce road costs in the future. The Lake Committee is working to re-draw the overall lake usage guidelines and spell out the responsibilities of boat owners and users to improve both the safety and enjoyment of the lake. Your Architectural Review Board is also working on revisions to those rules and guidelines. The Member Services Committee is planning on a new and more useful Member directory for the spring of 2019.

The Historic Toxaway Foundation is continuing to install signage identifying HISTORIC TOXAWAY as well as working with the County to place Lake Toxaway on some of the Wayfinding signs on Hwy 64. These should help us direct our friends and visitors to find us whenever they visit.
